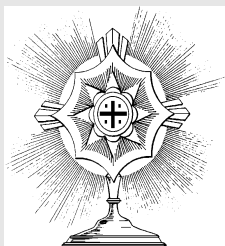

DONATION NEEDS FOR REFUGEE AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES

Refugee and Immigration Services of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond resettles refugees and assists immigrants in the Roanoke Valley. RIS resettles approximately 200 refugees every year. RIS resettled 78 refugees from Bhutan, Iraq, Myanmar, and Cuba in 2009. These families arrive with very few possessions. The following is needed now to help refugees arriving in the Roanoke area. Pots, pans, dishes, glasses, silverware, mixing bowls, kitchen knives, floor fans, laundry baskets, sheets (no king size), blankets, bed frames (no king size), bicycles, personal hygiene items.
